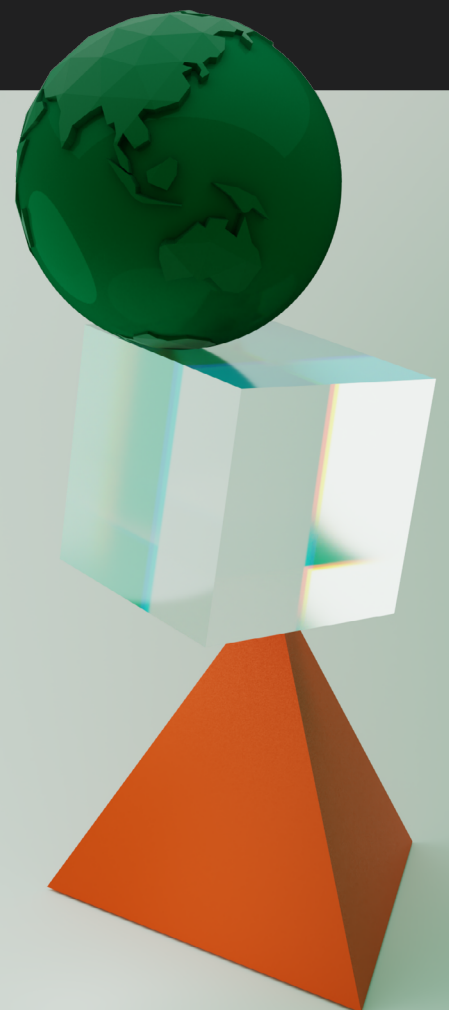

Index Rebalance Summary 2026



The Betashares Global Sustainability Leaders ETF (ASX: ETHI) aims to track the Nasdaq Future Global Sustainability Leaders Index (Index) before fees and expenses.

This report describes the changes made to the Index constituents as part of the annual index rebalance and reconstitution in May 2026. The process included a full screening of eligible constituents in accordance with the Index methodology.

Index additions

Thirty-six new companies were added to the Index. A few noteworthy examples are outlined below:

Company	Ticker	Rationale for addition
Eli Lilly & Co	LLY	The company's carbon efficiency improved over the course of the year, which resulted in its classification as a carbon leader.
Aena S.M.E., S.A.	AENA	The company's revenues from distribution of tobacco products accounted for less than 5% of total revenue.
Adyen N.V.	ADYEN	The company's carbon efficiency improved over the course of the year, which resulted in its classification as a carbon leader.
Rivian Automotive Inc	RIVN	See Scope 4 Inclusions below.

Scope 4 Inclusions

Rivian Automotive, EDP Renovaveis SA and Nextpower Inc., were newly added Scope 4 companies, which replaced Enphase Energy, First Solar and Compagnie de Saint-Gobain S.A.

- **Rivian Automotive (Ticker: RIVN):** Rivian Automotive is a U.S.-based electric vehicle manufacturer focused on producing electric trucks, SUVs and commercial delivery vans designed to accelerate the transition to low-carbon transportation and reduce transport-related emissions.
- **EDP Renováveis (Ticker: EDPR):** EDP Renováveis is a global renewable energy company specialising in wind and solar power generation, developing clean energy infrastructure that supports decarbonisation and reduces reliance on fossil fuels.
- **NextPower Inc. (Ticker: NXT):** NextPower is a renewable energy investment and development company focused on solar infrastructure and energy transition solutions that expand clean electricity generation and support global emissions reduction efforts.

Index deletions

Thirty-six companies were removed from the Index:

- Ten companies no longer qualified as Carbon Leaders i.e.; the companies did not meet the criteria to be in the top third most carbon efficient companies within their industry.
- Fifteen companies did not meet market capitalisation requirements.
- Three companies were replaced with a higher market capitalisation Scope 4 company.
- Eight companies did not pass the ethical negative screens (as per the Index Methodology) at this rebalance.

Some noteworthy examples are outlined below:
