Objective

GGAB seeks to generate magnified returns that are positively correlated to the returns from 10-year Australian Treasury Bonds. The Fund expects to generate a magnified positive return when 10-year Australian Treasury Bond prices rise (bond yields fall) on a given day, and a magnified negative return when bond prices fall (yields rise) on a given day.

Strategy

GGAB is a geared fund. It invests in cash and cash equivalents and buys 10-year Australian Treasury Bond Futures to obtain a magnified (or geared) exposure. The futures contracts reflect the returns of an underlying Australian Treasury Bond with 10 years to maturity.

GGAB's portfolio exposure is actively monitored and adjusted to stay within a 2.5x to 3x range on any given day. A 1% rise in the value of the bond on a given day can generally be expected to deliver a 2.5% to 3.0% increase in the value of GGAB (and a corresponding decrease if the value of the bond falls by 1%). GGAB's returns will not necessarily be in the range of 2.5x to 3x over periods longer than a day, due to the effects of rebalancing and compounding of investment returns over time. GGAB does not track a published benchmark.

Investors in geared strategies should be willing to accept higher levels of investment volatility and potentially large moves (both up and down) in the value of their investment. Gearing magnifies gains and losses and may not be a suitable strategy for all investors.
